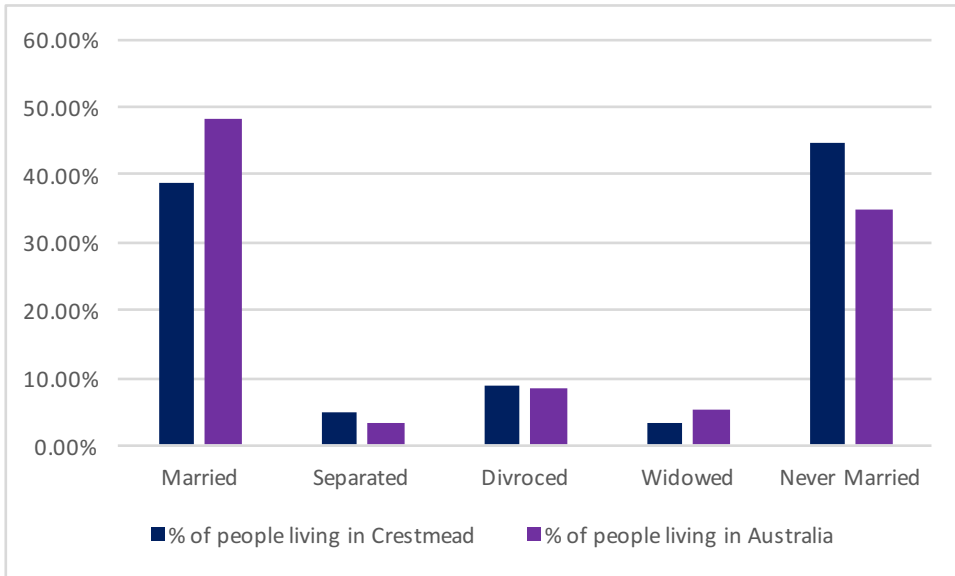

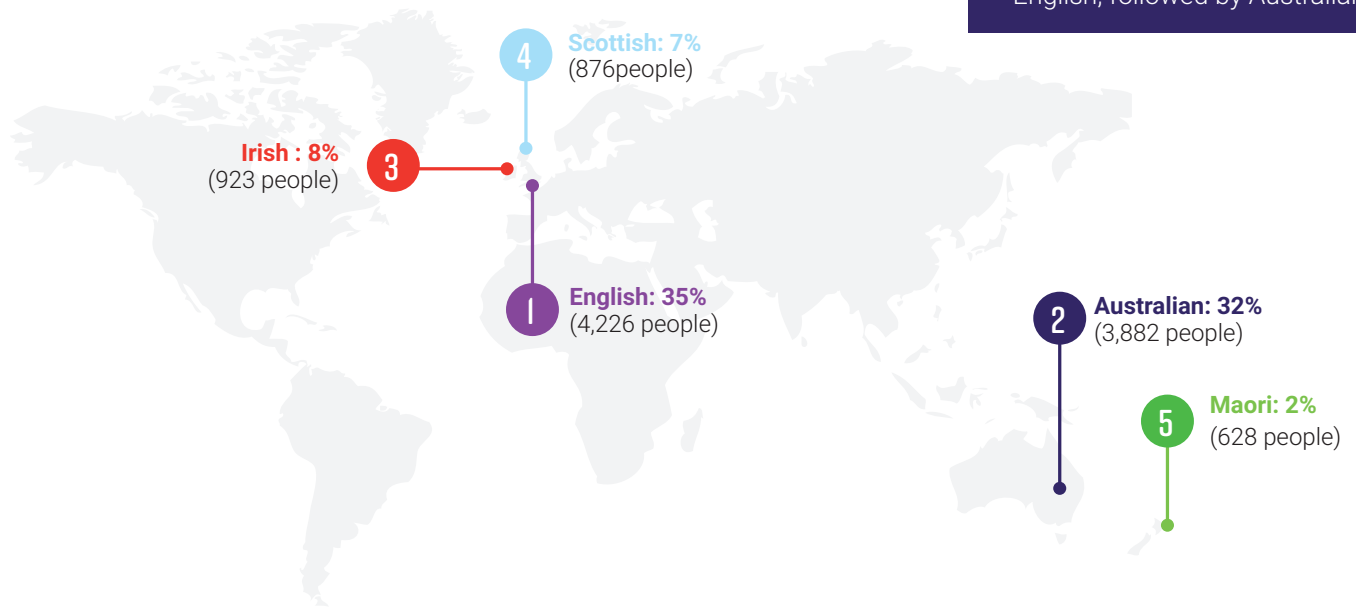

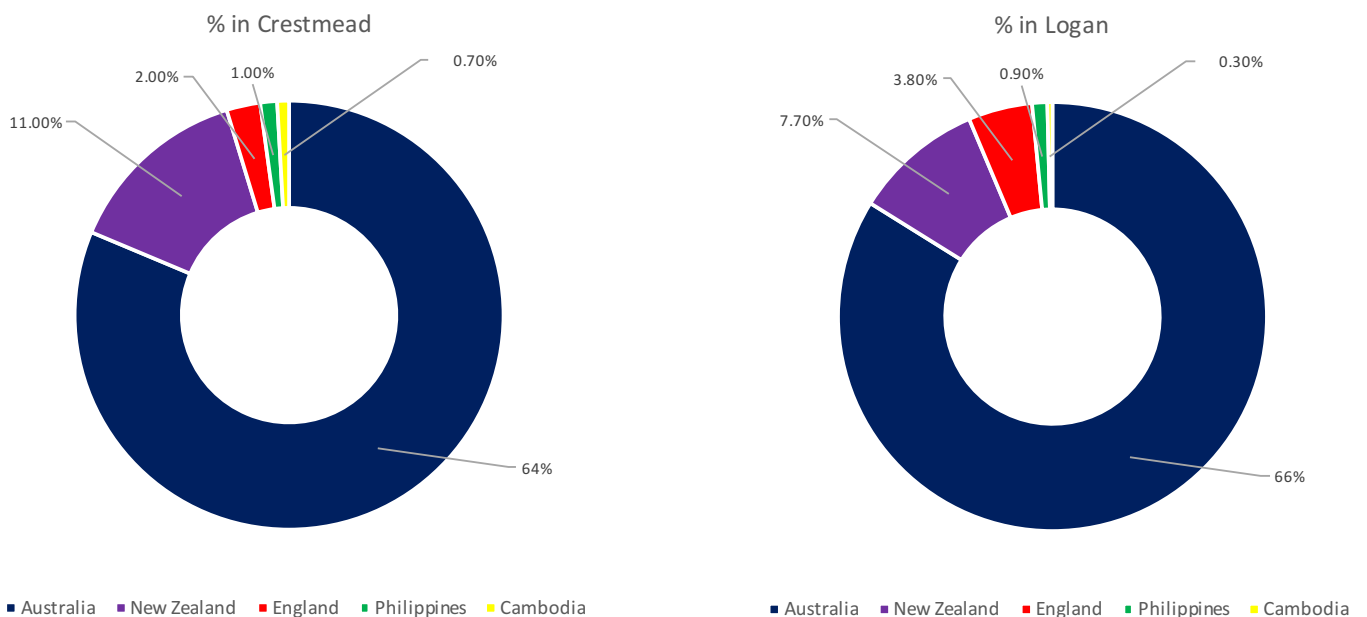
FIGURE 2: ANCESTRY OF PEOPLE LIVING IN CRESTMEAD (TOP 5 COUNTRIES OF BIRTH OF PARENTS)

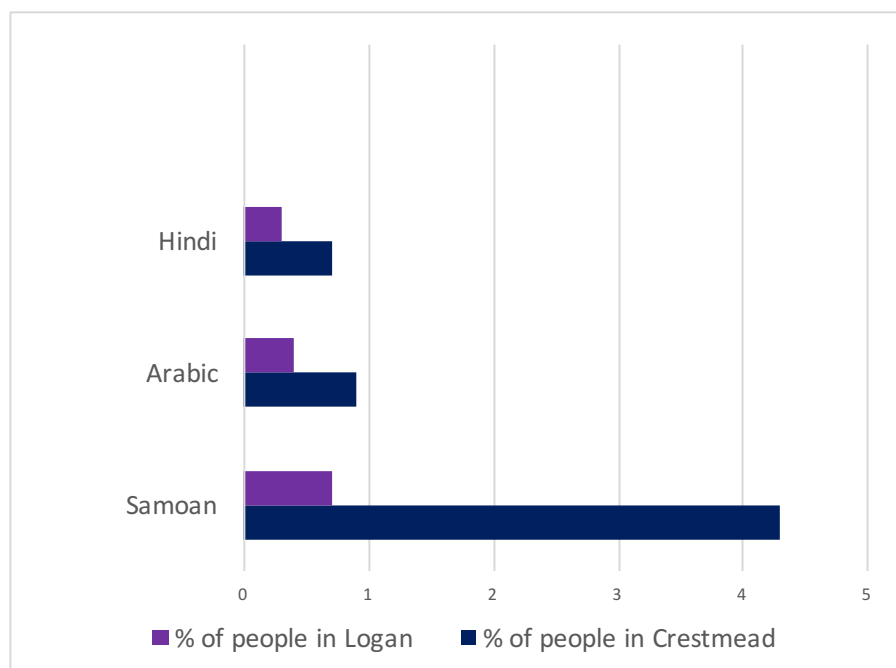

EARLY EDUCATION AND CARE

There are many different types of early education and care services. Most are regulated under the National Quality Framework (NQF) including; family day care, long day care, kindergarten/preschool and outside school hours care.

Regulated services are required to meet high national standards to ensure children are safe and are given opportunities for learning and development on a regular basis. These services are given quality ratings to help families choose the best service for their child and family.

The National Quality Framework introduced a new quality standard in 2012 to improve education and care across long day care, family day care, preschool/kindergarten, and outside school hours care services.

ECEC centres and NQS rating

Services are assessed against the 7 quality areas of the National Quality Standard (NQS) and given an overall rating based on these results.

The National Quality Framework includes the National Law and National Regulations, the National Quality Standard, an assessment and quality rating process and national learning frameworks.

The overall service ratings are:

- Excellent rating, awarded by ACECQA
- Exceeding National Quality Standard
- Meeting National Quality Standard
- Working towards National Quality Standard
- Significant Improvement Required

Services must display their ratings at the service at all times.

The 7 quality areas of the National Quality Standard are:

1. Educational program and practice
2. Children's health and safety
3. Physical environment
4. Staffing arrangements
5. Relationships with children
6. Partnerships with families and communities
7. Leadership and service management

FIGURE 5: CRESTMEAD STATE SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016

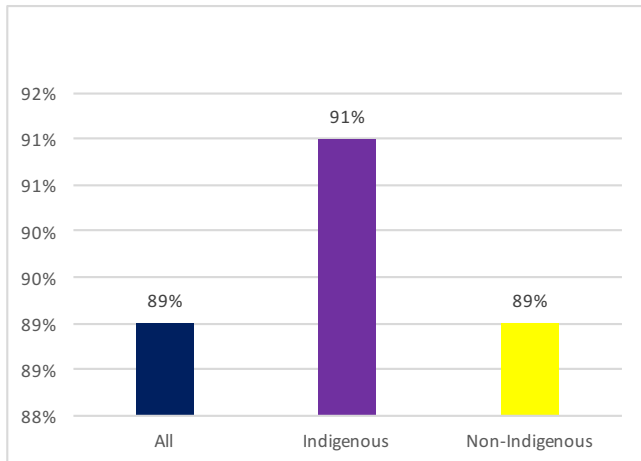
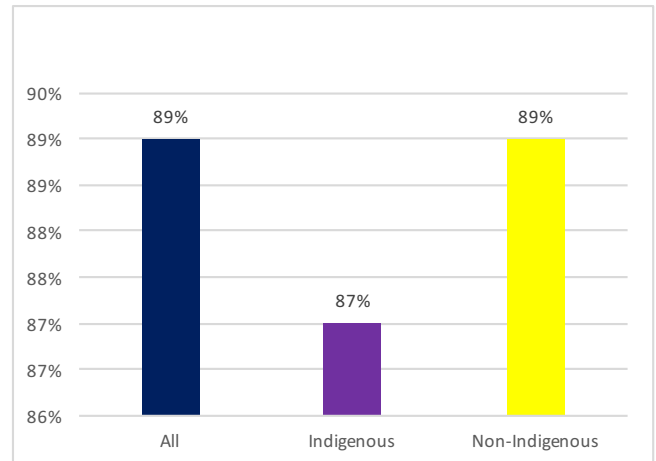


FIGURE 6 ST FRANCIS COLLEGE STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016



AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS (AEDC)

The AEDC is a nationwide measure that looks at how well children across Australia are growing up or ‘developing’.

The AEDC looks at five different elements or domains that are important for children’s development. These are: physical health and wellbeing, social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive skills (school-based); and communication skills and general knowledge.

The AEDC is collected every three years in schools across Australia. The data collection was completed in 2009, 2012 and 2015.

Crestmead has the highest percentage of children developmentally vulnerable on one or more domains and ranks 5th highest in the percentage of children who are developmentally vulnerable on two or more domains.

Crestmead has the highest percentage of children who are developmentally vulnerable in language and cognitive skills at 26.2%. The suburb also ranks 6th highest in physical health and wellbeing and social competence. Crestmead also ranks 7 highest in emotional maturity and communication skills and general knowledge.

Crestmead is the only suburb that appeared in the top ten across all domains.

NAPLAN PERFORMANCE

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses all students in Australian schools in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. In the tables below, “NMS” refers to National Minimum Standard.

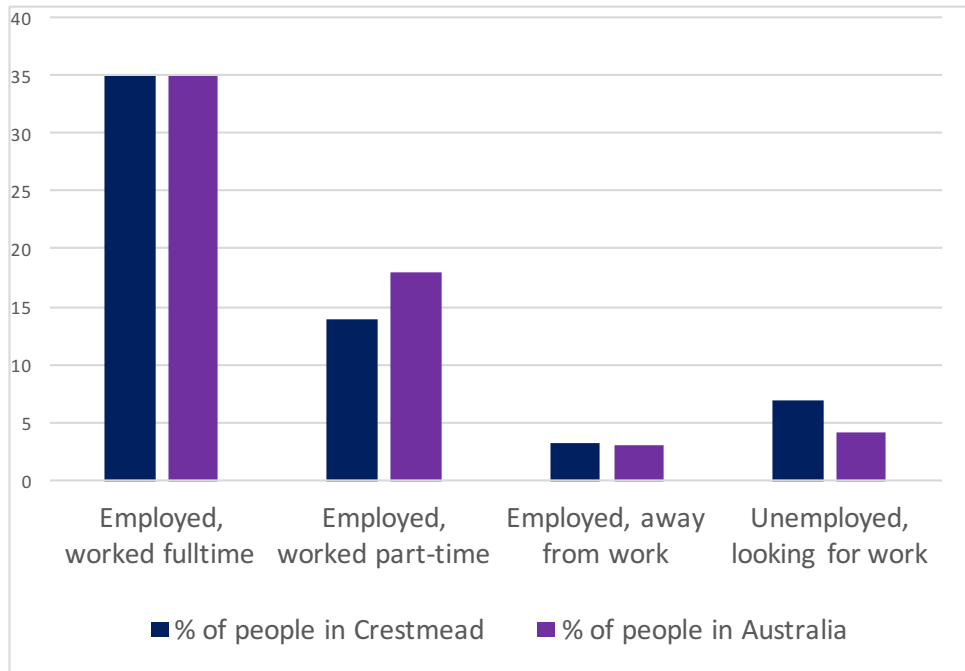

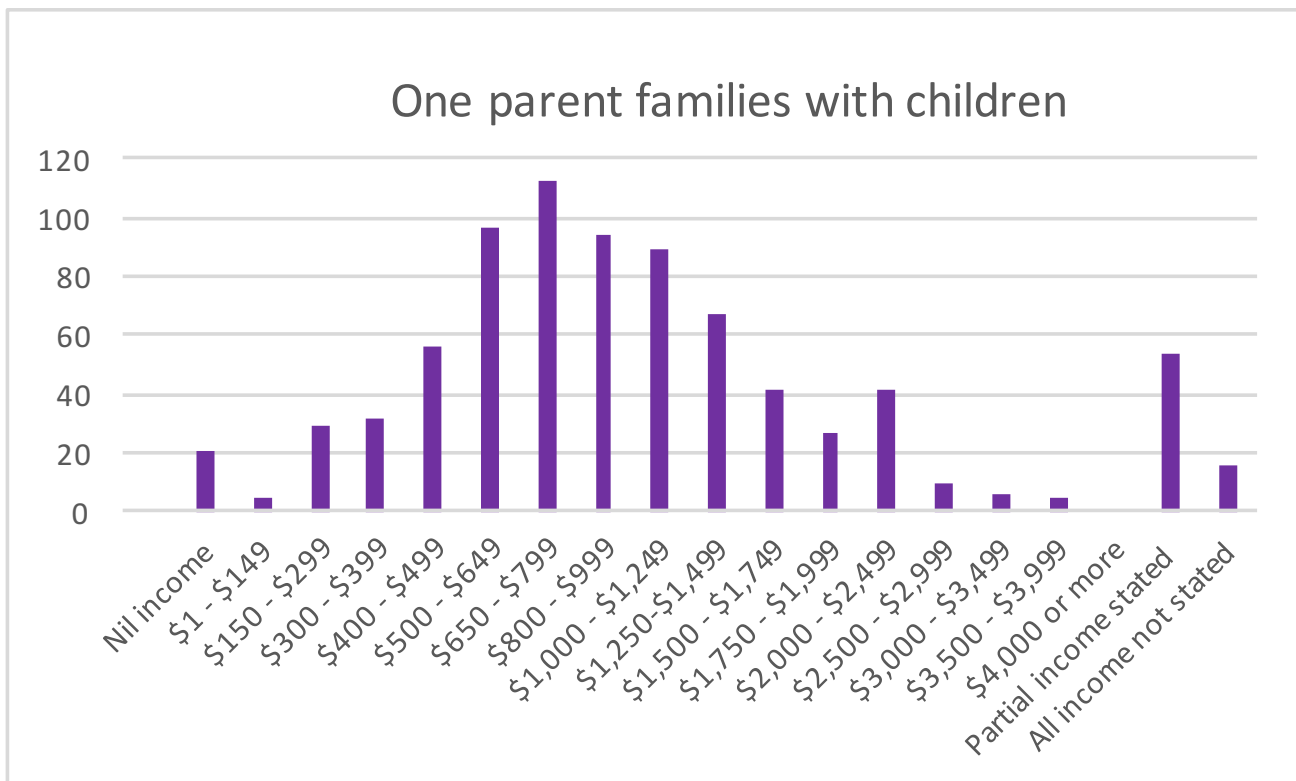
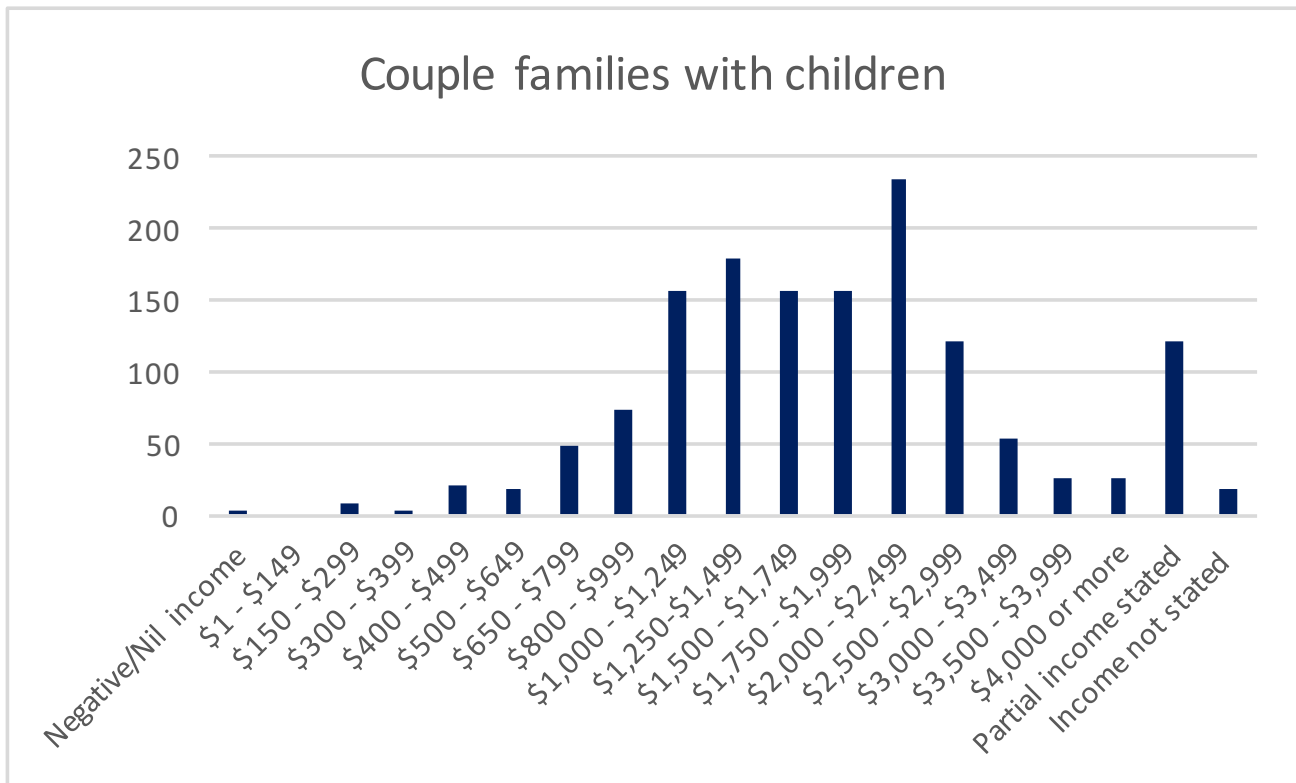

FIGURE 9: NUMBER OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY DWELLING

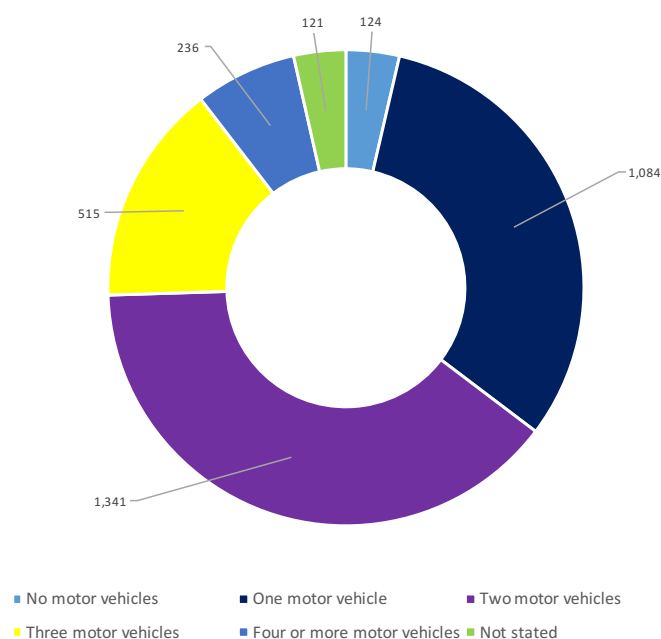
