







EARLY EDUCATION AND CARE

There are many different types of early education and care services. Most are regulated under the National Quality Framework (NQF) including; family day care, long day care, kindergarten/preschool and outside school hours care.

Regulated services are required to meet high national standards to ensure children are safe and are given opportunities for learning and development on a regular basis. These services are given quality ratings to help families choose the best service for their child and family.

The National Quality Framework introduced a new quality standard in 2012 to improve education and care across long day care, family day care, preschool/kindergarten, and outside school hours care services.

ECEC CENTRES AND NOS RATING

Services are assessed against the 7 quality areas of the National Quality Standard (NQS) and given an overall rating based on these results.

The National Quality Framework includes the National Law and National Regulations, the National Quality Standard, an assessment and quality rating process and national learning frameworks.

FIGURE 5: EAGLEBY SOUTH STATE SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016





FIGURE 6 EAGLEBY STATE SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016



AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS (AEDC)

The AEDC is a nationwide measure that looks at how well children across Australia are growing up or 'developing'.

The AEDC looks at five different elements or domains that are important for children's development. These are: physical health and wellbeing, social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive skills (school-based); and communication skills and general knowledge.

The AEDC is collected every three years in schools across Australia. The data collection was completed in 2009, 2012 and 2015

Eagleby is ranked third highest in the percentage of children developmentally vulnerable in Physical Health and Wellbeing. The suburb also ranked fourth highest in Social Competence, and sixth highest in Communication Skills and General Knowledge.

Eagleby has 36.9% of children (ranked sixth highest) developmentally vulnerable on one or more domains and ranked the highest with 25.8% of children developmentally vulnerable on two or more domains.

NAPLAN PERFORMANCE

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses all students in Australian schools in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. In the tables below, "NMS" refers to National Minimum Standard.









FIGURE 9: NUMBER OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY DWELLING


