

## Yarrabilba - Community Profile

Upon completion in 2041 it is expected that Yarrabilba will have approximately 17,000 homes with a population of approximately 45,000 people. Yarrabilba will cover 2,029 hectares of which 25% will be reserved for open space, environmental corridors, bushland, parks etc. A total of 11 schools (public and private) are proposed offering a full range of educational facilities from early childcare and learning to secondary and potentially higher learning.

Caltex has recently opened in addition to an IGA and a medical centre. Commencement of a Cole's supermarket has begun (planned to open in November 2017).

The Yarrabilba super park (Darlington Parklands) has recently opened. It has a 30m flying fox, water play area, fortress with slides, multi swing, outdoor gym, half basketball court, events oval, BBQ facilities etc.

The Exchange is a skilling and employment initiative with the objective of connecting local people to local jobs. The Exchange is a Lendlease initiative supported by yourtown, Gold Coast School of Construction, Access and The Hornery Institute.

**Population:** In the 2016 census there were 3,580 people living in Yarrabilba. Of these 47.6% (1,702) were male and 52.4% (1,877) were female.

**Age:** There were 912 children between 0-9 years of age in 2016 which is 25% of the total population. Yarrabilba is a community of young families with 82.2% of the population aged 0-40 years. The average age of people living in Yarrabilba is 25 compared to 38 nationally.

The most common ancestries in Yarrabilba were Australian 29.9%, English 27.8%, Irish 6.35, Scottish 5.3% and German 4.2%.

**Country of Birth:** 75.8% of people living in Yarrabilba were born in Australia. The most common countries of birth were New Zealand 6.9%, England 2.5%, Fiji 0.7%, South Africa 0.6% and Samoa 0.5%. 53.7% of people had both parents born in Australia and 23.2% of people had both parents born overseas.

English was the only language spoken at home for 85.5% of responses (3038), there were 120 households where a non-English language is spoken in the home.

**Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Peoples:** There are 153 people who identify as Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander in Yarrabilba. 76 (49.7%) are male and 77 (50.3%) are female. The average weekly income for Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander households is \$1,625 with an average of 3.2 people per household.

In Yarrabilba 33% of people are attending an educational institution. 96 children were attending preschool (there is no definition provided in the census form so this could cover any age and any form of Early Education and Care). This is 17.7% of children aged 0-4. It is noted that there are 96 children aged 4 in Yarrabilba which aligns with the number of children attending preschool (requires further investigation).

Yarrabilba currently has one primary school (St Clare's Catholic Primary School) currently open for prep to year 4 students. There is a projected enrolment of 300 students by 2021 and an ultimate enrolment of 700 students. Fees are \$2,850 per annum for prep to year 2. Years 3-6 fees are \$3,100 per annum. Yarrabilbas first state primary school is due to open in 2018. As at July 2017 the closest state primary school is Logan Village Primary School.

Logan Village Primary School has approximately 713 enrolments from Prep to Year 6. Enrolments are expected to increase as the Beenleigh, Beaudesert corridor continues to grow as a residential area.

Logan Village Primary School Naplan results for Year 3 in 2016 show scores below or substantially below both statistically similar schools and all Australian schools.

The Harmony Early Learning Journey Child Care centre in Yarrabilba has recently opened and caters for children aged 0-5. The centre provides meals, nappies and bedding. Following the success of the centre the Harmony Early Learning Centre are building a second centre within the community. The centre can take the following number of enrolments. The centre runs a kindergarten/school readiness program for children aged 3-5 years of age.

Of occupied private dwellings in Yarrabilba 91.1% were separate houses with a further 8.9% that were semi-detached, row or townhouses. No flats/apartments were recorded. There were 1,152 occupied private dwellings recorded and 256 unoccupied.

71.6% of recorded dwellings have 4 or more bedrooms 21.5% with 3 bedrooms and only 5% with 2 bedrooms. There were no 1 bedroom properties identified. The average number of people per dwelling is 2.9.

There are 926 family households and 180 single or lone person households. In addition there are 42 group households.

Of occupied private dwellings 4.8% were owned outright, 464 owned with a mortgage and 599 are rented.

The average rent in Yarrabilba is \$390 per week \$55 more than the national average of \$335. 77.2% of renters state that their rental payments are less than 30% of their household income. 22.8% (136) of rented properties have weekly payments that are greater than 30% of their household income.

Average mortgage repayments are \$1820 a month. 90.3% of households had repayments that were less than 30% of their household income, 9.7% of households had repayments greater than 30%.

**Vehicles:** There are 1,150 registered vehicles in Yarrabilba. 30.5% of occupied private dwellings had one registered vehicle garaged or parked at their address. 49.6% had two registered vehicles and 15.6% had 3 or more. There were only 18 private dwellings (1.6%) that did not have any vehicles registered to the address.

*Internet:* 88.7% of households can access internet from the dwelling (via desktop, laptop, computer, mobile or smart phone, tablet, music or video player, gaming console, smart TV or any other device).



**Social Media:** There are a number of facebook social media platforms that have been created within the Yarrabilba community. These are as follows:

- 1. Yarrabilba Mums: Has 596 members. Yarrabilba Mums is a safe place for mums to meet other mums, organise playdates, and even get ideas from other mums. We are all for supporting each other in the journey of raising our tiny humans.
- 2. Yarrabilba Classifieds: A buy sell, swap, advertise group which currently has 142 members.
- 3. Yarrabilba Womens Club: Yarrabilba Woman's Club (386 members) is for all ladies age 18-99 who would like to meet others and make friends in the Yarrabilba and surrounding areas. Whether you've had a stressful week of work or your toddlers found their independence (or both!) rest assured knowing you can look forward to a chat with the girls in the near future. The club will hopefully meet once every 2 weeks.
- 4. Yarrabilba Families: Residents only group has 1,909 members to date. Purpose of the page is to connect families in Yarrabilba, to bring a sense of community and a "get to know your neighbours" safe environment. The group is designed to share events, notices and general information for the Yarrabilba community. General chat between members is encouraged but the focus is to be community and family related.
- **5.** Yarrabilba Whinge and Bitch has 859 members. Lots of discussion regards bad neighbours, crime such as car damage (keying, tyres being let down etc.).
- **6.** Yarrabilba Blokes: Has 316 members. This page is designed for the blokes of Yarrabilba to have a chat, give advice, lend a tool, share job offerings or even give a helping hand.
- 7. St Clares Primary School Parent Group: has 117 members
- 8. Real Yarrabilba Whingers: 169 members
- 9. Yarrabilba Jobs: 625 members
- 10. Yarrabilba Lost Pets: 184 members
- 11. Yarrabilba Fitness Buddies: 169 members
