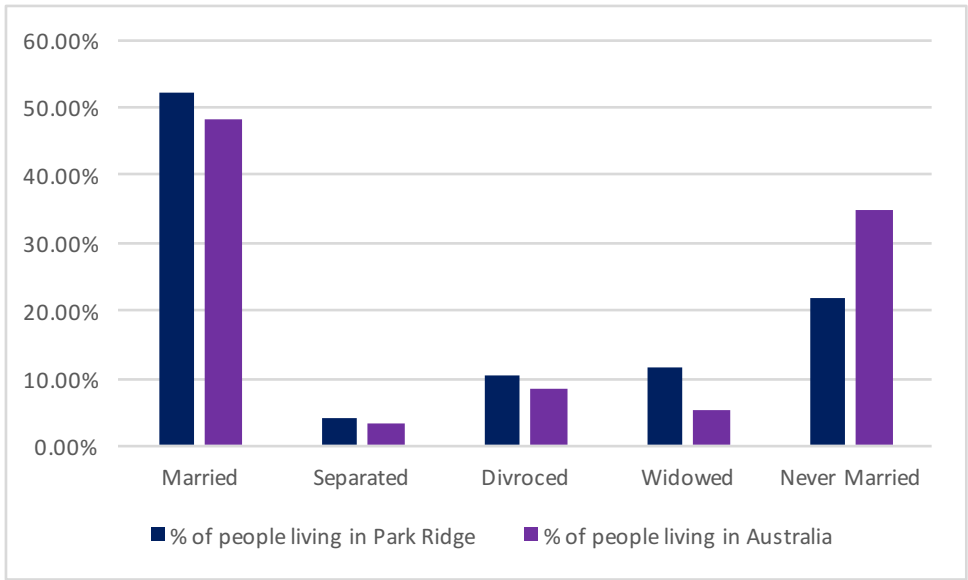

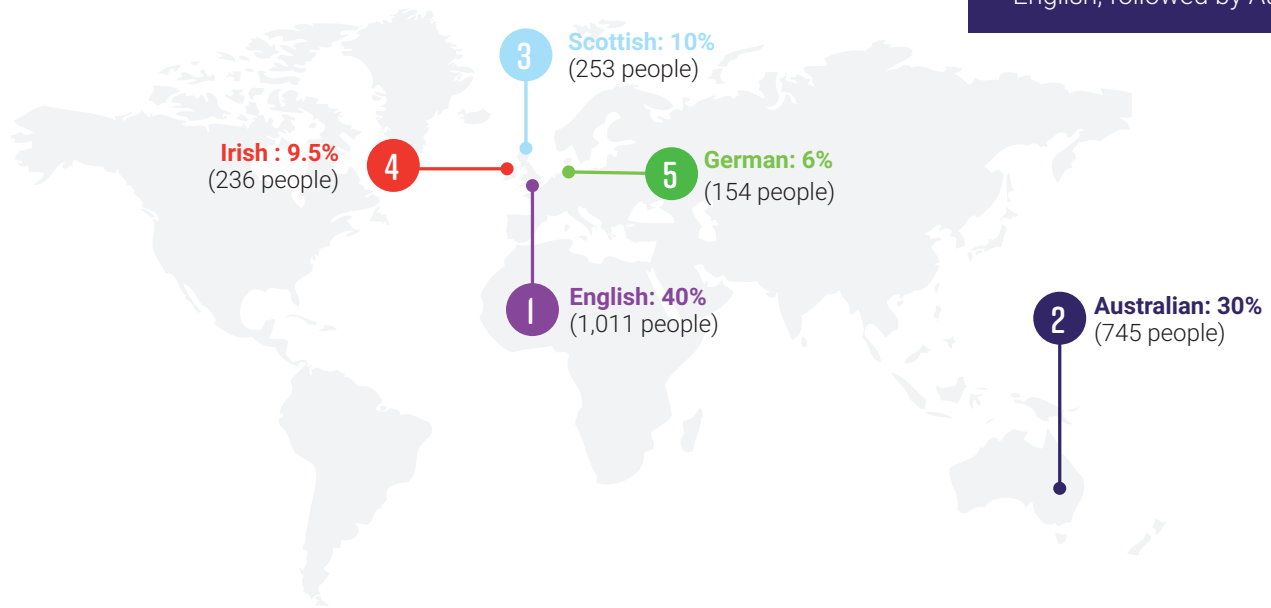

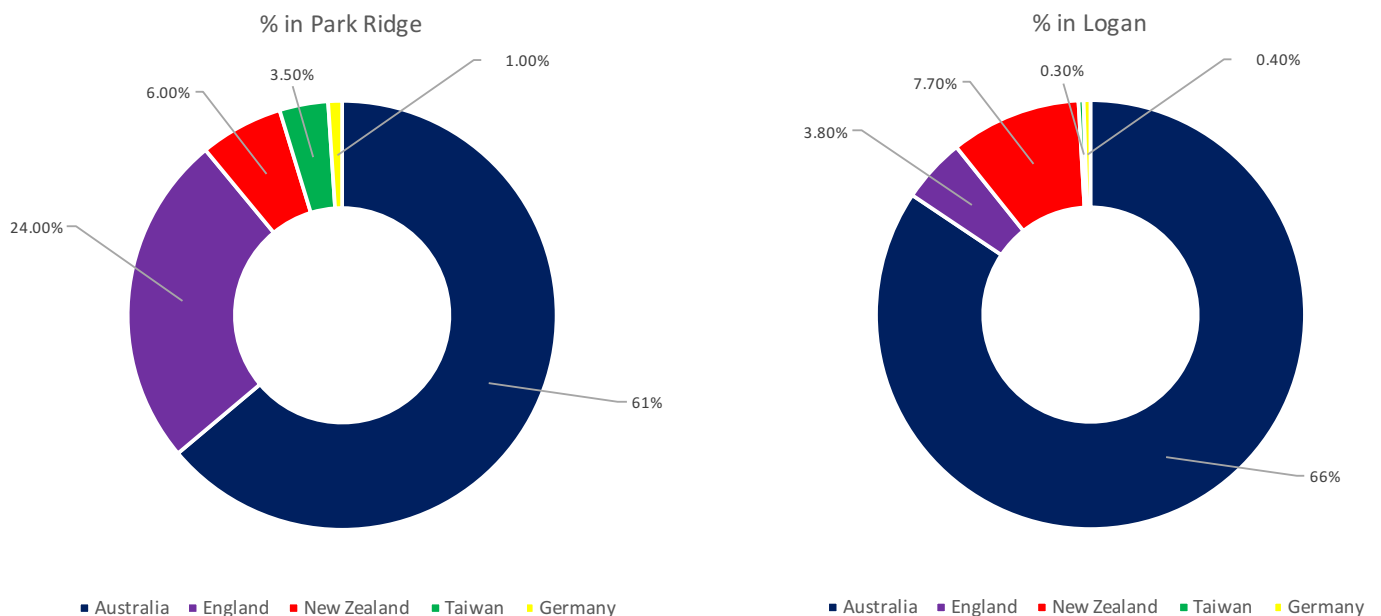
FIGURE 2: ANCESTRY OF PEOPLE LIVING IN PARK RIDGE (TOP 5 COUNTRIES OF BIRTH OF PARENTS)

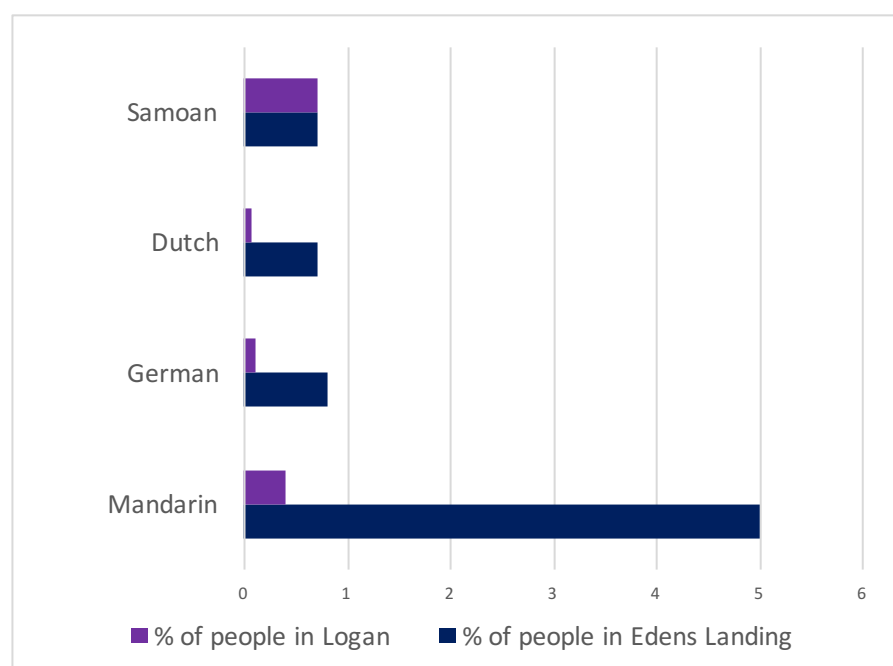

EARLY EDUCATION AND CARE

There are many different types of early education and care services. Most are regulated under the National Quality Framework (NQF) including; family day care, long day care, kindergarten/preschool and outside school hours care.

Regulated services are required to meet high national standards to ensure children are safe and are given opportunities for learning and development on a regular basis. These services are given quality ratings to help families choose the best service for their child and family.

The National Quality Framework introduced a new quality standard in 2012 to improve education and care across long day care, family day care, preschool/kindergarten, and outside school hours care services.

ECEC centres and NQS rating

Services are assessed against the 7 quality areas of the National Quality Standard (NQS) and given an overall rating based on these results.

The National Quality Framework includes the National Law and National Regulations, the National Quality Standard, an assessment and quality rating process and national learning frameworks.

The overall service ratings are:

- Excellent rating, awarded by ACECQA
- Exceeding National Quality Standard
- Meeting National Quality Standard
- Working towards National Quality Standard
- Significant Improvement Required

Services must display their ratings at the service at all times.

The 7 quality areas of the National Quality Standard are:

1. Educational program and practice
2. Children's health and safety
3. Physical environment
4. Staffing arrangements
5. Relationships with children
6. Partnerships with families and communities
7. Leadership and service management

FIGURE 5: PARK RIDGE STATE SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016

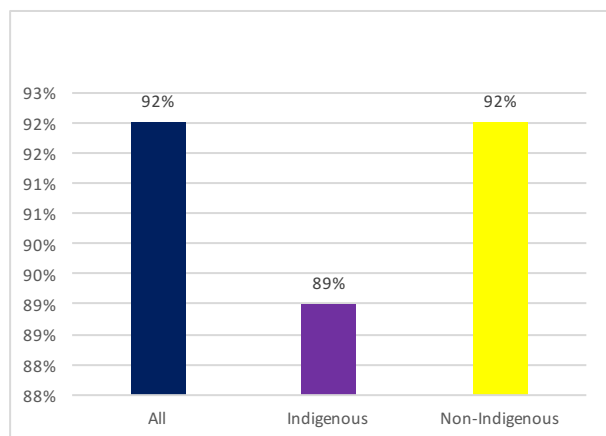


FIGURE 6: PARK RIDGE STATE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016

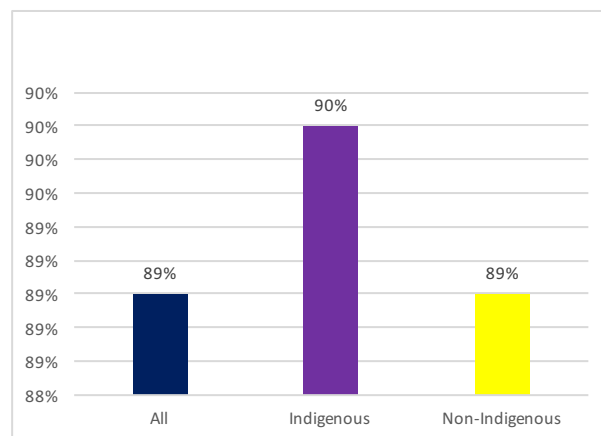


FIGURE 7: PARKLANDS CHRISTIAN COLLEGE STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016

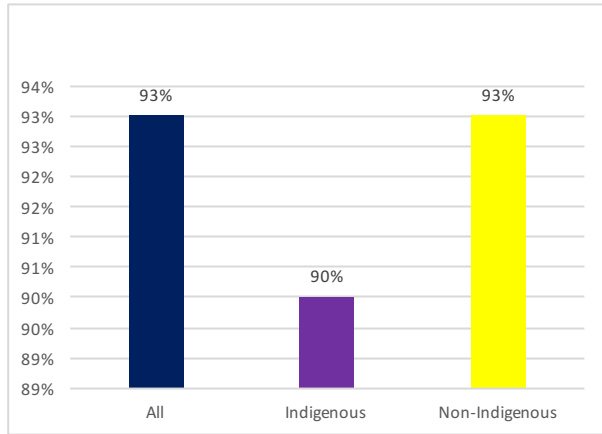
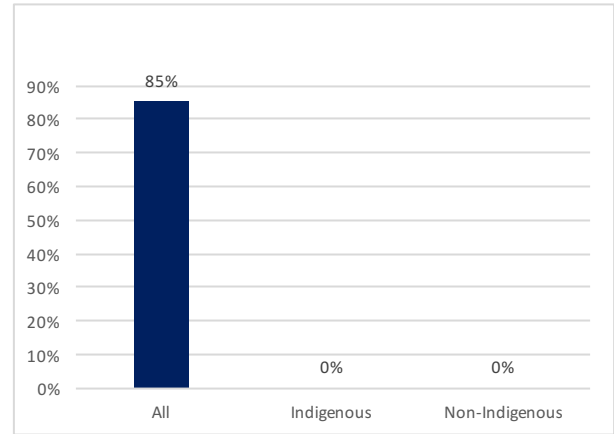


FIGURE 8: SAINT PHILOMENAS SCHOOL STUDENT ATTENDANCE - TERM 3 2016



AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS (AEDC)

The AEDC is a nationwide measure that looks at how well children across Australia are growing up or ‘developing’.

The AEDC looks at five different elements or domains that are important for children’s development. These are: physical health and wellbeing, social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive skills (school-based); and communication skills and general knowledge.

The AEDC is collected every three years in schools across Australia. The data collection was completed in 2009, 2012 and 2015.

Park Ridge ranked 2nd highest where children were developmentally vulnerable in social competence. Park Ridge also ranked 8th most vulnerable suburb in language and cognitive skills after Crestmead, Woodridge, Logan Central, Waterford West, Loganlea, Kingston and Waterford. This suburb also ranked 10th most vulnerable in Emotional maturity after Logan Village, Windaroo, Bahrs Scrub, Loganholme, Mount Warren Park, Munruben, Crestmead, Daisy Hill and Kingston.

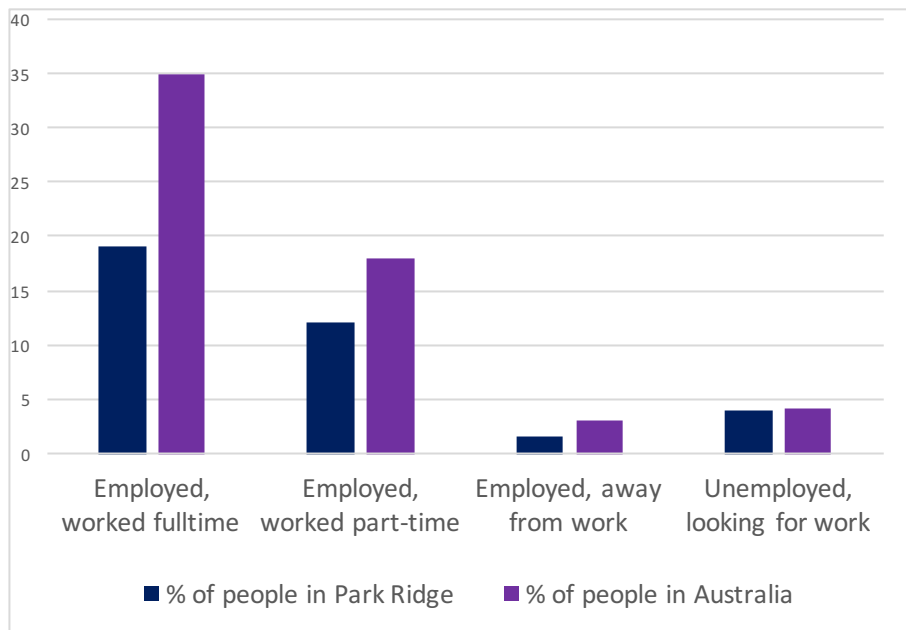

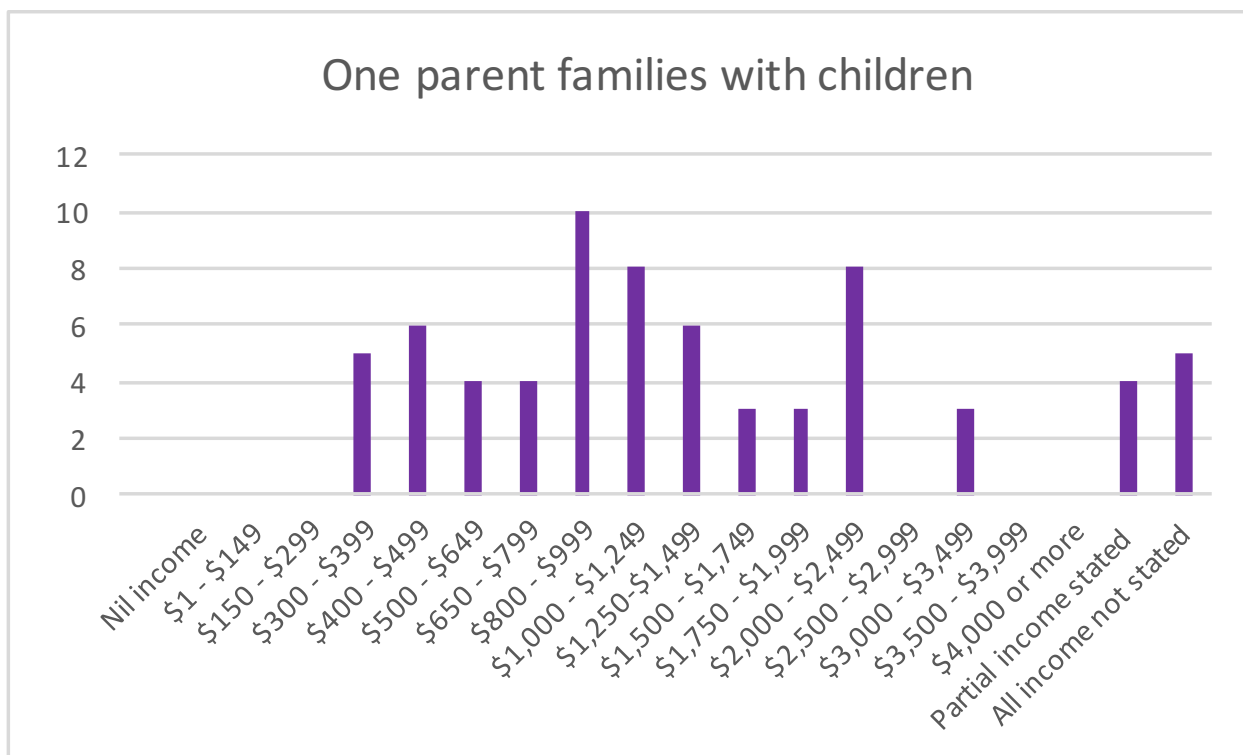
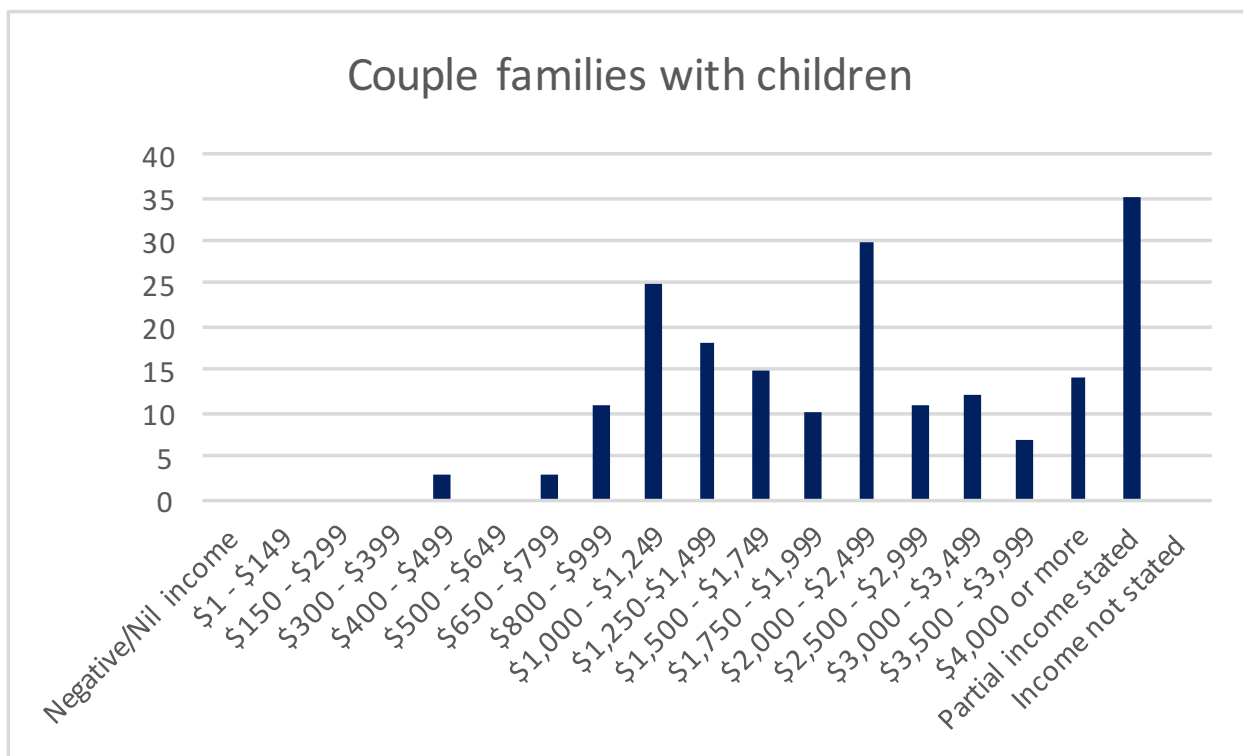

FIGURE II: NUMBER OF MOTOR VEHICLES BY DWELLING

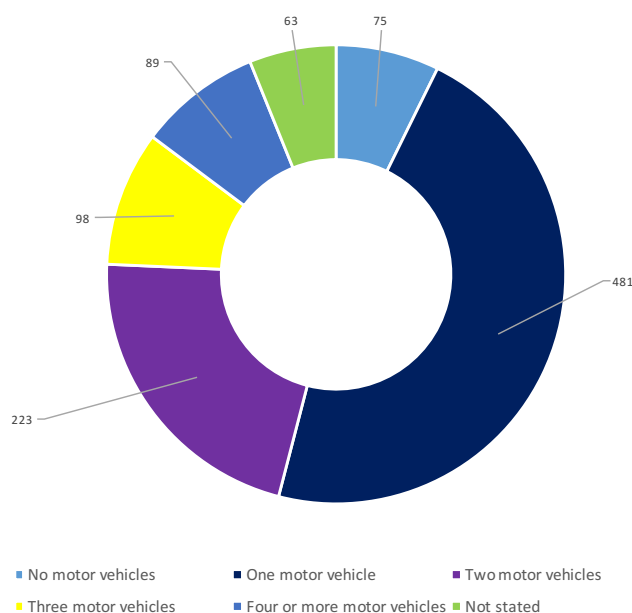
